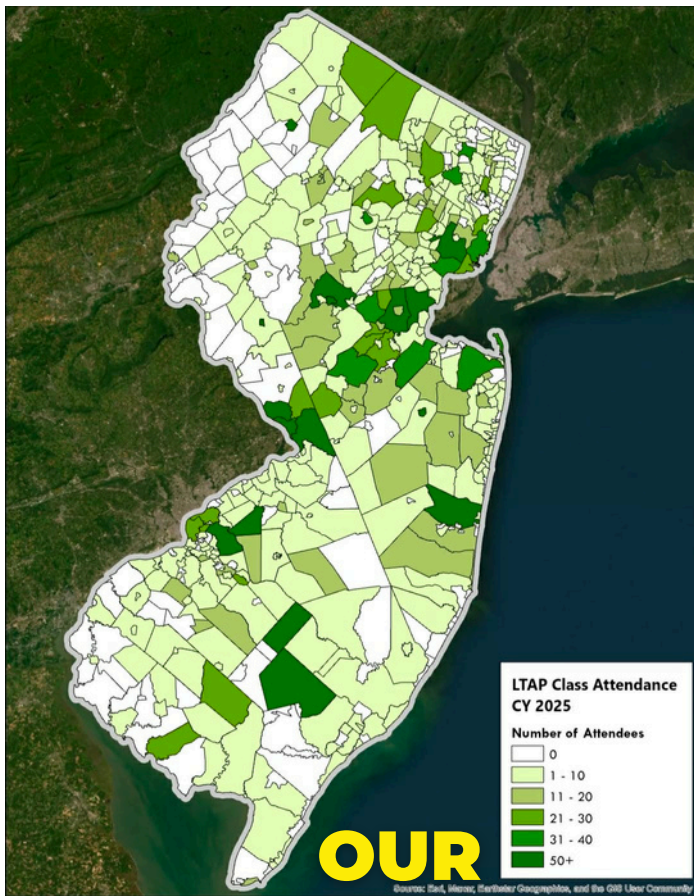

The STIC helps NJDOT identify and rapidly deploy proven yet underutilized innovations to shorten project delivery, enhance safety, reduce congestion, and improve environmental sustainability. NJ's STIC members are a cross-section of stakeholders from across the state working together to forge an environment of innovation, imagination and ingenuity.

New Jersey's Build a Better Mousetrap Competition highlights practitioners that use their creativity and expertise to solve everyday challenges through new processes, tools, and services. Each year NJLTAP accepts submissions from employees of local or state public agencies that have come up with new and innovative solutions that improve safety, reduce costs, and increase overall efficiency.

NJDOT's Bureau of Research, Innovation, and Information Transfer has an Ideas Portal. This portal gathers and shares ideas from research customers across the state, with particular emphasis on those that are implementable solutions. Submissions from local agencies for needed research include diverse topics from the testing and adoption of new materials and technologies to better specifications and greater efficiency. Ideas are then shared more widely, and the best of these are prioritized for development and posting as research proposals.
